Kaikondhrahalli lake in the city of Bengaluru faced many of the typical problems that urban water bodies in India face, including encroachment by buildings on its periphery, sewage disposal and immersion of religious articles during festivals.

However beginning in 2009 people of varied backgrounds including citizens , private donors and the local administration came together to carry out various restoration activities such as de-silting and providing alternative tanks for religious activities. Kaikondhrahalli is now a source of fodder for nearby villages, a recreation site for urban visitors and home to bird and other animal life. It is part of a wider attempt

In the city of Pune in Maharashtra, a unique effort is ongoing in an attempt to decentralize decisionto restore a chain of water bodies in a city which was once famed as the city of lakes.

Part of that effort recognises that protecting lakes begins at the points of origin of sewage and other urban waste - homes, colonies and offices. Rainbow Drive is a colony of over 300 households in Bengaluru that harvests rainwater in each house and on streetsides, treats and recycles its wastewater, composts all its wet waste and organizes recycling of its solid wastes. This effort was begun by the residents themselves and the systems are maintained collectively.

Participatory Budgeting in Pune

Pune Municipal Corporation makes a separate allocation of Rs 50 lakhs per electoral ward for citizens to make suggestions for works to be done in their ward.

- Provision introduced in 2006 and implemented every year since then
- Budget allocated for such works is 1-2% of the total municipal budget
- Type of works eligible: Footpaths/bicycle tracks, Playgrounds, Gardens, Signs, Bus stops, Traffic lights, Streetlights, Toilets, Waste, Water, Sewage, Roads and Others.
- *Centre for Environment Education (CEE) Urban Programmes Group is working with PMC and citizens group in Pune to evolve such improvements to PB processes.
